VICTORIAN 1830-1900

Romanticism of nature, informal gardens, cottages Moral dilemma with exploitation of nature (westward expansion, subjugation of Native Americans, pollution from industry, conspicuous waste Idolized nature to make up for feeling guilty about ruining nature Industrial aristocracy (robber barons), rise of the middle class

MACHINERY: technology shows in construction, like circular saw 1830-50 Fret machine 1850 Carving machines 1851-57 Mortising machine 1857 Steam powered machines 1861 (including steam bending)

TRANSPORTATION: faster transfer of goods 1820's to 30's canal system, 1850-> railroad

Stains, varnishes, masonite as secondary wood Furnishings books, Godey's ladies book, trade catalogs to advertise 1876 Philadelphia Centennial Exhibition—display of history of American styles Started a revival period of copying old styles in new technology til 1920's




GOTHIC REVIVAL 1840-60

Serious furniture (i.e. for libraries) copies 12th-16th century styles Pointed arches, trefoils, quatrefoils, tracery, crockets, Tudor roses Cluster columns bold silhouettes woods= walnut, oak









Recilinear, form follows function [Craftsman, Prairie, Mission] oak Rebel against machine—in England William Morris began movement In US leaders were Frank Lloyd Wright, Greene & Greene in Pasadena CA, Roycrofter Colony in upstate NY, Gustav Stickley (The Craftsman Magazine);

hammered iron and Copper hardware, through tenons extend


