

This high-style, Federal house was built in 1825 by architect Colonel Lemuel Porter for Augustus Baldwin, a prosperous Hudson merchant. It was subsequently owned by the Buss and later the Merino families. In 2019, Baldwin-Buss House Foundation (BBHF) was formed when the home was once again on the market and the fate of this historic landmark house was at risk. With seed money from Hudson Heritage Association and extensive community fundraising, BBHF set out to purchase, preserve and renovate the building. In partnership with Peg's Foundation, the project will become a reality, with plans to restore this home to its original glory, to be a community asset for years to come.
